Suzanne Gieser has a PhD in the History of Sciences (specialty history of psychiatry and psychotherapy) and is also a licensed psychotherapist specialized in trauma and supervisor. She works both with a private practice and as employed at a specialist clinic for sexually traumatized in Stockholm, Sweden. She has studied the psychology of CG Jung since 1981, and the relationship between Jung and the physicist Wolfgang Pauli. Her book, *The Innermost Kernel: Depth Psychology and Quantum Physics. Wolfgang Pauli's Dialogue with C.G. Jung* was published in English in 2005. She was a senior lecturer and associate professor for ten years at The Institute of Analytical Psychology (IAP), a private institute of Jungian scholarly studies in Stockholm and has authored several articles and prefaces related to C. G. Jung and Wolfgang Pauli in Swedish and English, including the article on Jung in

the *Swedish National Encyclopedia*. She is a member of the board at the Swedish C. G. Jung Foundation and is co-founder of the Swedish Association of Imago Therapy. She is the editor of Jung's 1937 and 1938 seminars in Bailey Island and New York, published in 2019.

Psychedelics, the theory of its use in the treatment of different psychic symptoms and syndromes and the research in that field from a Jungian perspective

Humans have used serotonergic hallucinogens (i.e. psychedelics) for spiritual, ceremonial, and recreational purposes for thousands of years, but their administration as part of a structured therapeutic intervention is still a relatively novel practice within Western medical and psychological frameworks. In the mid-20th century, considerable advances were made in developing therapeutic approaches integrating administration of low (psycholytic) and high (psychedelic) doses of serotonergic hallucinogens for treatment of a variety of conditions, often incorporating psychoanalytic concepts. This work contributed seminal insights regarding how these substances may be employed with efficacy and safety in targeted therapeutic interventions, including the importance of optimizing set (frame of mind) and setting (therapeutic environment). More recently, clinical and pharmacological research has revisited the effects and therapeutic potential of psychedelics utilizing a variety of approaches.

Treatment of complex PTSD (C-PTSD) and dissociation with psychedelics is an emerging area of research. While studies are ongoing, preliminary findings suggest promising results for specific psychedelics, such as MDMA, psilocybin, and ketamine.

I have been trained in one specific form of treatment called Psychedelic Somatic Interactional Psychotherapy (PSIP), to treat complex PTSD (C-PTSD) and dissociation, with the assistance of ketamine. I have been working with this method, but am still a beginner in the field.

My presentation will focus on the field of psychedelic research, the theory behind the treatment of simple and complex PTSD and dissociation with the assistance of psychedelics. I will also link this to a Jungian perspective and focus more on the clinical process with some clinical examples.
