


Two-days conference on the 8th and 9th of October 2021

in Medborgerhuset Pilegården, Brønshøjvej 17, 2700 København with Martin Stone and Judith Pickering



The use of the body in Jungian analysis.



Martin Stone is a Supervisor, Training Analyst and past Chair of the Association of Jungian Analysts, in London. He has written papers on splits in Jungian groups, embodied countertransference, frequency of sessions in analysis, and the keynote speech for the conference 'Who is my Jung?'. He is interested in these topics and in synchronicity and typology.

He was joint coordinator for the Russian Revival IAAP router training programme in Moscow, and has taught and examined in Russia and Serbia.

Lecture on Friday the 8th of October:

Embodied Countertransference: experience, theoretical understanding, use of interpretation.

Martin Stone will draw on his 2006 paper 'The Analyst's Body as Tuning Fork', as well as on earlier and more recent papers, and will explore the connection with mirror neurons and phenomena such as mirror touch synaesthesia. During the morning group work session, the focus will be on the practical use of embodied countertransference as a tool for interpretation, and participants are invited to bring their own examples and experiences to explore and discuss in the group.



Dr Judith Pickering is a Psychoanalytic Couple and Family Therapist, Psychoanalytic Psychotherapist and Training Analyst, working in private practice in Sydney, Australia. She has lectured and taught widely in Australia, USA and Europe and teaches and supervises for both ANZSJA, The Australian and New Zealand Society of Jungian Analysts, and for ANZAP, The Australian and New Zealand Association of Psychotherapy. She is on the editorial board of the Journal of Analytical Psychology, London. Judith is also a musicologist and classically trained singer and has

developed music education programs to teach children and parents from birth to adulthood.

Lecture on Saturday the 9th of October: Acoustic resonance at the dawn of life: Musical Fundaments of the Psychoanalytic relationship

Music is the language of emotions, and it is through the musical elements of verbal communication that emotional content of communication is conveyed. The musical elements are from the dawn of life fundaments of the later vocal expression and continue to be a channel of communications in their own right.

Vocal attunement is essential in an intersubjective analytic relationship. Attuned analysts will intuitively resonate with the overtone series of the patient's utterances, and responses will harmonise with the tonality, timbre, idiom, melodic modality of the patient. We can uncover such paralinguistic information about the patient's inner state Through analysing "musical" aspects of the patient-analyst communication and they help determine attuned therapeutic responsiveness. The differences between an intersubjective athmosphere of mutuality and the mosphere of a patient catapulted into a traumatic memory system will be explored.

This clinical presentation will enable the participants to identify the musical elements of their work and the emotional meanings conveyed through acoustic elements of patient-analyst communication. You are invited to bring clinical material to share regarding these themes. Judith will be with us from 10-12.45.
