Ethical and unethical aspects of supervision

This 2 1/2 days course from Friday, Oct. 19 at 10:00 am to Sunday, Oct. 21 at 14:00 pm is the second supervisor course orginised by DSAP and the Jung Institute in Copenhagen. Like the first course in 2016 this course will be informed by a psychodynamic approach including theorectial and clinical aspects of analytical psychology and will combine the theory and practice of clinical supervision.

The clinical component of the course will be organized around small groups with supervision of supervision or supervision of cases. Participants are encouraged to bring examples with ethical aspects of their own supervisory cases as well as their analytic cases to the course. Each group will be led by one of the lecturers/organizers.

We welcome participants who are trained as psychotherapists and/or Jungian psychoanalysts and have worked in clinical practice for at least two to three years. We welcome also those therapists and analysts who have begun to supervise and would like to learn more.

Generally

The supervisor has a professional responsibility to ensure that his/her supervisees are developing well, especially if they are in training. The supervision process can make intense demands on the supervisor, especially when having to evaluate candidates, and on occasion, convey to supervisees that there are problems in their way of working. With more intensive psychotherapy, the supervisor needs to be able to help supervisees recognize when their clients are regressing, need additional support than the therapy can provide, and when supervising candidates within their own institutes, attend carefully to professional boundaries.



Ethical Considerations

The course will circle around the major areas for ethical consideration by a supervisor and supervisee:

- Protection of the patient's well-being
- Protection of others from the patient
- Upholding standards within the profession of psychotherapy
 - Boundaries
 - Frame
 - Confidentiality
- Competence of supervisee and supervisor
- Professional and personal development of candidates
- Assessment of candidates' progress
- Health of supervisee and supervisor
- Training and support for supervisor
- Misbehaviour
- Role of the ethics committee/ training committee
- Institutions / law / liability
- Professional indemnity insurance
- Confidentiality about colleagues (e.g. doubting the competence of a candidate's analyst)
